The Cochiti Mining District

This district is known to be enormously rich in gold bearing quartz of high grade, free milling. Some of the most expert mining men have declared this district the richest gold deposits known.

The Cochiti Indians

Among these Indians there is a tradition that many years ago a member of their tribe knew the location of a deposit of very rich gold ore, from which he extracted the yellow metal in large quantities. The exact whereabouts of this deposit was never ascertained, as the Indian met with an untimely end and his secret died with him.

The Property

The holdings of the Mont de Lion Mining Company are situated in the Peralta Canon, Cochiti District, Sandoval County, New Mexico, and consists of a total area of about four hundred and fifty acres.

The Mineral

We have rich gold bearing mineral in seemingly inexhaustible quantities—easily mined. Some of the assay reports indicate radium.

The Water

Peralta Canon has water sufficient to operate at least a 100-stamp mill. The flow of water has never known to fail, winter or summer, and is abundant.

The Timber

Peralta Canon is in the nature of a gorge, or ravine, with high walls, heavily timbered with splendid pine trees, some of which will cut from five hundred to eight hundred feet of lumber. We estimate that we have ten million feet of timber on the property.

Labor

Near at hand labor may be obtained at reasonable wages.

Railroad Facilities

The nearest railroad station is Domingo, some twenty miles distance. The grade from Domingo to the mines is a very easy one, and with a little work a good auto road can be constructed.

To Operate

We believe that this mine can be operated at a very small cost, which should not exceed one (\$1.00) dollar per ton, and as the assays show from \$8.40 to as high as \$126.00 per ton, some idea of the profits may be arrived at.

In Sight

There is in sight enough ore to keep a 100 stamp mill in active operation for the next fifty years.

The Climate

With an elevation of about five thousand feet above sea level, we have an ideal climatic condition, which permits of activity every day of the year, with no distressing heat in summer, nor extreme cold in winter.

The Peralta Canon

This may properly be called the master canon of the Cochiti range of mountains. It has a course due south from its head, veers slightly to the west, emptying into the Rio Grande at the Pueblo of Cochiti. It thus leads all the canons of the Cochiti Mineral District.
