My dear Mr. Holland:

I am very pleased indeed to have received your good letter, which had been forwarded on to me here from Texas office, and it is with pleasure that I can respond in any way to advise or assist you in a fulfillment of your desire.

You know something about my efforts as engineer of mines in Los Angeles, and how little real money was available there at any angle of the profession you may pursue. That is why I built up stakes and decided to devote my energies to the oil business, and I assure you that I have no reason to regret it. My operations in Texas have been very successful, and also has paved the way for a lot of splendid business for sometime to come. I came on here last May, and the above Company have been consuming my interest since about the first of August.

My associates acquired some very valuable leases, scattered through the proven area West Texas, and have put them into this organization, on a developing basis, and everything has progressed very nicely so far. We are now on our big well, about a \$55,000 shot in the West Ranger field.
