The Vanadium Mines company of Cutter, N. M., one of the biggest enterprises that has been started in New Mexico in recent years, has been placed in the hands of a receiver. The receiver named is W. A. Bonitz, vice president and general manager of the company and one of those most active in its organization. Mr. Bonitz arrived from Cutter last night and left for Pittsburg this evening, where he will remain for ten days of longer.

"It is true that the Vanadium has gone into the hands of a receiver," said Mr. Bonitz this afternoon. "This is for the purpose of reorganization, however. Every
