From Santa Fe New Mexican.
The Vanadium Mines company
of Cutter, N. M., one of the big-
gest enterprises that has been start-
ed in New Mexico in recent years,
has been placed in the hands of a
receiver. The receiver named is
W. A. Bonitz, vice president and
general manager of the company
and one of those most active in its
organization. Mr. Bonitz arrived
from Cutter last night and left for
Pittsburg this evening, where he
will remain for ten days of longer.

"It is true that the Vanadium
has gone into the hands of a re-
ceiver," said Mr. Bonitz this af-
ternoon. "This is for the purpose
of reorganization, however. Every
creditor will be paid dollar for dol-
lar. We expect to effect reorgan-
ization at once; to expend \$100,-
000 additional in enlarging the
plant on which we have already
expended a great deal of money.
