The New Mexican has reliable
 information that the survey of
 the proposed change in the main
 line of the Santa Fe railroad
 over Glorieta hill has been
 completed. The new line will be
 a little north of the present line
 and will be mostly along the side
 of the hill, high enough to be
 out of the reach of the floods of
 the Galisteo. In place of the
 present grade of four per cent a
 grade of one and a half per cent is
 to be secured by driving a tunnel
 one and one half miles in length
 through Glorieta hill. The east
 end of the tunnel will be at
 Pigeon's ranch.
