Buckeye Mine

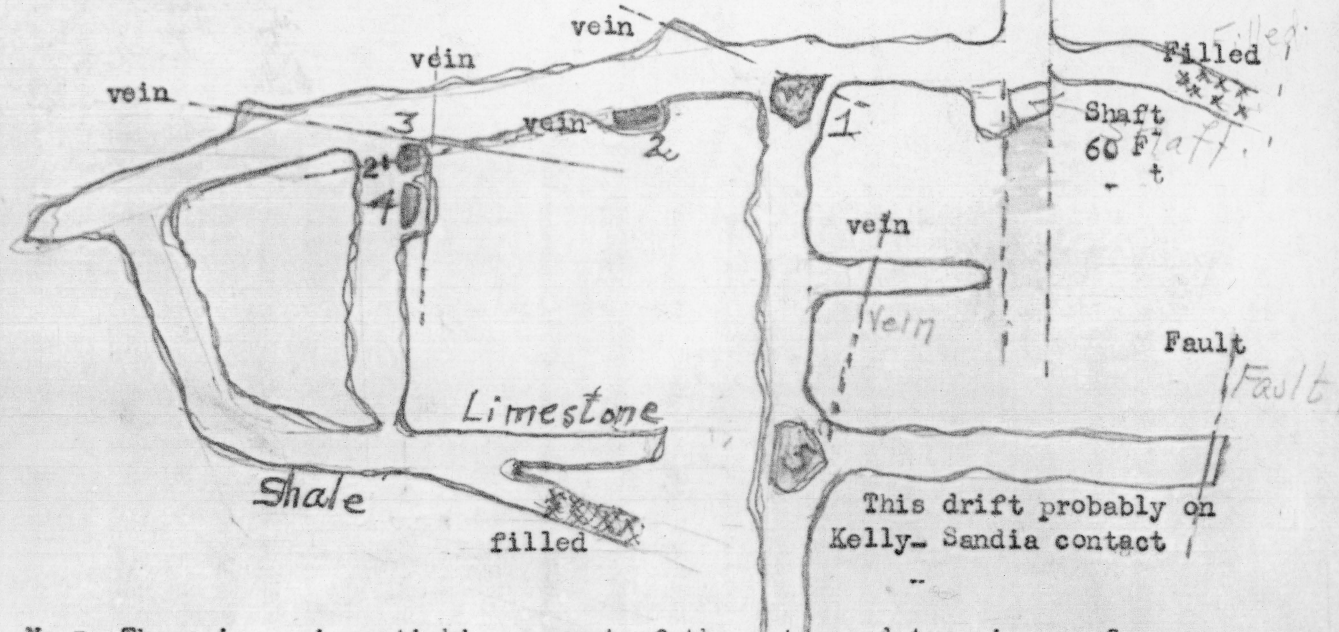
100 Foot Level

- No. 1 This vein has been worked nearly 20 ft. above leve.
Apparently same vein went down below water.
No. 2 and No. 1 possibly the same vein. Goes down but not up.
No. 3 Cuts No. 2 at a slight angle. Goes down. Looks like the intersection of these two veins had been worked down below water level
No. 4 Has been worked downward for 10 ft. Vein was 10 " where exposed.
All of these veins are likely to be much bigger and richer below water level.



- No 5. There is a pipe sticking up out of the water and two pieces of smaller pipe lying along track in drift. I judge there had been a pump in this place at one time. Probably this was a winze or under hand stope on an ore body.
